Instructions for ordering a course pack:

Part 1: Set up your [Landmark College Bookstore](#) account. (or call directly at 802-387-6862)

1. Go to the Landmark College Bookstore
2. Select Login and Create Profile for Browsing and Shopping.

Note! You will need to create a username and password. We suggest using the same username and password that you use to access your courses.

Part 2: Order the course pack.

1. Go to the [Landmark College Bookstore](#) and log in.
2. Select Order Textbooks
3. In the Search for Book field type the subject (e.g. WRT) and course number (e.g. 1011) and select the coursepack for your section (X)
4. Select the copy and choose ADD TO CART
5. Select CONTINUE CHECKOUT
  - If you want a physical copy of the coursepack, select UPS Ground and enter shipping info.
  - If you only want a digital copy, select “Pick up at Store” and call or email the bookstore to request your digital copy.
6. Fill out payment information and submit payment. The bookstore will send a confirmation email to the email address you used for your bookstore login.
